WHEN STUDENTS OF GEOGRAPHY **READ** THEY:

- Identify and determine key words in a text.
- Interpret data in graphs, tables, maps, and photos.
- Think critically about the text and constantly ask 'why?'.
- Summarise and synthesise.
- Seek to find patterns and connections between key themes.

WHEN STUDENTS OF GEOGRAPHY **WRITE** THEY:

- Use key geographical terms, including human and physical geography terminology.
- Use factual and case study knowledge to answer questions.
- Use PEEL and TEA to develop and construct well-structured and critical answers.
- Use detailed evidence from sources such as tables, maps and graphs in written answers.

WHEN STUDENTS OF GEOGRAPHY **THINK** THEY:

- Make judgements on key themes.
- Constantly analyse and question.
- Use case studies and examples from the wider world to guide their thinking.
- Compare and contrast causes and effects of human and physical geography.
