The most difficult:

<u>Knowledge</u>	<u>Skills</u>
Reference to others – recognising when the verb has changed from I to he / she / we or they. Negatives – spotting when a sentence becomes negative because “ne...pas” (not) or “ne...jamais” (never) has been added Conditional Tense – spotting “I would” endings such as ‘j’aimerais’ in French Passé composé Tense – understanding key past verbs in French	Annotating the listening questions Listening twice for detail, before deciding the answer Silently “playing back” what you heard in your head, until you have processed what you heard

How to get top marks:

This will be a listening assessment, so you must annotate the questions before you listen, then listen twice carefully before deciding on the answer.
