SUPPORTING YOUR CHILD

SAFEGUARDING

At Benton Park, the safety and wellbeing of our students is our highest priority. We are committed to creating a secure, nurturing environment where every young person feels safe, supported and able to flourish.

Safeguarding is a shared responsibility across our whole school community. All staff play a vital role in identifying and minimising risk, and we work closely with external agencies to ensure that children who may be vulnerable receive the care and protection they need – both in and out of school.

Our Safeguarding Team is always on hand to provide tailored support for students and families. Whether it's offering guidance, making referrals, or simply being there to listen, the team ensures that no child or family faces challenges alone. If you have any concerns during term time, please don't hesitate to contact the team directly. You can find more information and resources on our website.

Supporting Mental Health and Wellbeing

We understand that mental health is just as important as physical health. That's why we offer a wide-ranging and compassionate mental health support programme for all our students.

Our Mental Health First Aid Team is specially trained to support students who may be struggling. Weekly drop-in sessions are available, and staff can make referrals for more personalised support. We offer a variety of strategies tailored to each student's needs, including:

- Wellness Action Support Plans
- Targeted mentoring
- Support from Leeds Faith in Schools, MindMate, and the Cluster
- Access to our in-house counsellor

We also believe in the power of peer support. Our trained MindMate Ambassadors in Years 8-11 are a friendly, approachable team who run their own weekly drop-ins, create wellness zones, and help new students settle in during their transition to Year 7.

Mental health education is embedded throughout our curriculum. From Wellbeing Wednesdays to PD lessons and morning meetings, students are regularly given tools and strategies to support their emotional wellbeing.

INCLUSION

At Benton Park School, we believe that every child deserves to feel seen, supported, and celebrated. Inclusion is not just something we do – it's who we are. We are proud to be a school where every student is welcomed with kindness and given the support they need to flourish, both in the classroom and beyond.

A Whole-School Commitment

Inclusion is a shared responsibility across our school. Every adult in our community – teachers, support staff, and leaders – works together to create an environment where all students feel safe, valued, and able to succeed. We recognise that every child is unique, and we are committed to understanding and responding to their individual needs with care and compassion.

The Inclusion Team

Our Inclusion Team is made up of dedicated professionals who are passionate about helping young people thrive. Led by our experienced SENCo and Assistant SENCos, and supported by a team of skilled inclusion leads and teaching assistants, we work closely with students, families, and staff to ensure that the right support is in place at the right time.

Whether it's helping a student build confidence, supporting them with their learning, or simply being a trusted adult to talk to.

The Hub: A Place to Feel Safe and Supported

At the heart of our inclusive provision is The Hub – a calm, nurturing space where students can access personalised support throughout the school day. It's a place where students can take a moment to reset, receive targeted interventions, or simply feel safe and understood.

The Hub offers:

- Tailored support across all four areas of SEND
- A quiet, welcoming environment for reflection and regulation
- Access to specialist resources and equipment
- A sense of belonging for those who need it most

Inclusive Classrooms and Personalised Learning

We know that great teaching changes lives. That's why our classrooms are designed to be inclusive, supportive, and ambitious for every learner. Our teachers use a range

of thoughtful strategies to ensure that all students can access learning and feel confident in their progress.

Some of the key approaches we use include:

- **Dyslexia-friendly slides** with pastel backgrounds and clear fonts to support readability
- **Scaffolding** to break down tasks into manageable steps, helping students build independence and success
- **Chunking information** to reduce overload and support memory and understanding

These are just a few of the many inclusive practices we embed across our school to ensure that every student feels supported, capable, and ready to learn.

Supporting a Positive Start

We understand that moving to secondary school can feel like a big step – especially for students with additional needs. That's why we offer enhanced transition support, including extra transition days, personalised visits, and early opportunities to meet key staff. These experiences help students feel more confident and connected before they even walk through the door in September.

Support Beyond the Classroom

Inclusion at Benton Park goes far beyond academic support. We work closely with our pastoral and safeguarding teams to ensure that every student's emotional and social needs are met with care and consistency. We also collaborate with a range of external professionals – such as educational psychologists, speech and language therapists, and mental health services – to provide the very best support for our young people.

Working Together with Families

We know that the best outcomes happen when school and home work hand in hand. That's why we place great value on building strong, trusting relationships with families. We listen, we share, and we plan together with our families to ensure all our young people can be successful with us at Benton Park.

PASTORAL CARE AND BEHAVIOUR

At Benton Park, we are deeply committed to creating a school environment where every student feels safe, supported, and able to thrive. We understand that young people learn best when they feel happy, secure, and valued – and our pastoral care is designed to make that a reality for every child.

Each year group benefits from a dedicated team of Pastoral Welfare Officers and Year Leaders who get to know students as individuals and provide consistent, compassionate support. These teams are further supported by Key Stage Leaders and a senior leader with responsibility for behaviour and wellbeing, ensuring that no student is ever overlooked.

We believe that every moment matters. That's why there is a visible adult presence on every corridor, every lesson, every day – ready to offer encouragement, guidance, or simply a reassuring smile. Our approach is rooted in kindness, responsibility, and belonging, and we work hard to build a culture where students feel proud to be part of our community.

We set high expectations for behaviour because we care deeply about our students' success. Our behaviour policy is designed to keep students safe and remove barriers to learning, while recognising that some young people may

need additional support along the way. We work closely with teaching staff, the Inclusion Team, and our Safeguarding Team to ensure that every student receives the care and guidance they need.

Our behaviour team is trained in Mental Health First Aid and understands the pressures and challenges that young people face today. We take a proactive, compassionate approach to behaviour, using positive framing and restorative conversations to help students reflect, grow, and move forward.

We are unwavering in our stance against bullying. Every student has the right to feel safe, respected, and free to be themselves. We act swiftly and firmly to protect that right, and we work with students and families to build a culture of empathy and respect.

At Benton Park, we believe that school should be a place where every child can come each day knowing they will be supported, challenged, and celebrated. A place where they can learn, grow, and truly belong.

TRANSITION

Supporting a Successful Start – Our Transition Journey at Benton Park School

At Benton Park School, we understand that the move to secondary school is a significant milestone – and we're committed to making it a positive, exciting and successful experience for every child. Our transition journey begins in Year 5, because we know that getting it right from the very beginning sets the tone for a student's entire school experience.

Our well-established transition programme is designed to help students feel confident, welcomed and ready to thrive. From early visits to primary schools by our staff, to dedicated transition days and family events, we ensure every child feels a strong sense of belonging before they even step through our doors.

We offer two carefully planned transition days. The first provides a smaller, more personal introduction to life at Benton Park, helping students explore the school environment and begin forming friendships. The second is a full-day experience where students meet their check-in tutors—trusted adults who will guide and support them throughout their time with us.

We also build strong connections with families through a

meet-and-greet session with check-in tutors and a parent collaboration meeting, giving parents and carers the chance to ask questions, share insights, and feel fully involved in their child's journey.

Our transition support continues well into Year 7. Students take part in a comprehensive induction week, a team-building day at Nell Bank, and a celebratory welcome party – all designed to help them settle in, build friendships, and feel part of our vibrant school community.

At Benton Park, we believe that every student deserves to feel safe, supported and inspired. Our transition programme reflects our commitment to kindness, inclusivity, resilience and belonging, and ensures that every child has the foundation they need to flourish – academically, socially and emotionally.

EQUAL OPPORTUNITY FOR ALL

At Benton Park, we are proud to be a school where every student feels valued, respected, and included. Our commitment to equality, diversity and inclusion is at the heart of everything we do, shaping a school culture where all young people can flourish.

We have published our Equality Objectives on our website, where we outline our aims to challenge discrimination in all its forms. These objectives reflect our aspiration to increase students' awareness, understanding and empathy, and to strengthen community engagement in our work around equality, diversity and inclusion.

In June 2024, we were delighted to be accredited with the Red Kite Alliance RED Award for Respect, Equality and Diversity. This award provided a valuable framework to evaluate our provision and celebrate the richness of our school community. The RED Assessment praised Benton Park for embedding equality and diversity into every aspect of school life, noting that:

In May 2025, our journey continued with the achievement of the UK Feminista Gold Award, a national accolade that celebrates our commitment to tackling sexism and sexual harassment. Over the past two years, we have worked tirelessly to empower students to recognise and report misogynistic and harassing behaviours, and to ensure all staff are trained to support students across every year group.

At Benton Park, equality isn't just a goal – it's a lived experience. We celebrate the diversity of our community and work together to ensure that every student feels safe, supported and inspired to succeed.

LEARNING AND THE CURRICULUM

At Benton Park School, high-quality teaching and learning are at the heart of everything we do. Our lessons are designed to inspire, stretch, and support every student. Each one is thoughtfully planned and delivered to ensure that all learners make meaningful progress in a dynamic, inclusive, and collaborative environment, all taking place in our fantastic first-class facilities.

We've recently undertaken a full review of our curriculum, guided by the principles of 'powerful knowledge' and evidence-informed planning and sequencing. This refreshed approach helps students make strong connections within their subject studies, laying the foundation for future success.

Our teaching 'fundamentals' are rooted in delivering exceptional learning experiences for every student, regardless of their starting point. We use a wide range of strategies to support learning in the classroom, and place great value on ongoing professional development for our staff – ensuring our students benefit from the very best in education.

Learning at Benton Park goes far beyond the classroom. We actively encourage our students to try new things, explore their interests, and take part in enriching experiences they'll remember for a lifetime. From local trips to residential adventures, our extracurricular programme offers something for everyone, helping students grow in confidence and curiosity throughout their seven-year journey with us.

Our school operates on a one-week timetable, with six 50-minute lessons each day. Every morning begins with either a check-in session with tutors or a morning meeting that sets the tone for the day. These sessions include subject-based quizzing using Knowledge Organisers and conclude with our shared 'Big Read' – a moment to connect through literature.

We also dedicate weekly curriculum time to Personal Development, where students explore what it means to live a happy, healthy, and successful life in modern Britain. This includes regular careers education and opportunities to reflect on their personal growth.

At Benton Park, we believe every student deserves access to a rich and varied school experience – one that extends far beyond the classroom. We are passionate about offering exciting opportunities that allow students to explore their interests, develop new skills, and be recognised for their efforts and commitment to our five core school values.

By the time students reach our Sixth Form, they are not just learners – they are leaders, role models, and young adults ready to take the next step. We place great importance on fostering a sense of belonging, where every student feels seen, supported, and valued throughout their time with us.

OUR SIXTH FORM CENTRE

Our Sixth Form Centre, located in a carefully repurposed building, offers a vibrant and welcoming space that reflects the independence and maturity of post-16 study. It's a place where students feel respected, supported, and inspired to achieve their best.

The Centre includes:

- Bright, modern classrooms equipped with up-to-date technology
- A dedicated Sixth Form café serving hot and cold food throughout the day
- A spacious common room for socialising, relaxing, and building friendships
- Silent study rooms and private workspaces with access to computing facilities

We offer a wide range of Level 3 courses, including both A Levels and vocational qualifications, allowing students to tailor their learning to their interests and future aspirations. Whether students are aiming for university, apprenticeships, or employment, our curriculum is designed to support every pathway.

Our partnership with Guiseley FC provides exciting opportunities for students interested in sport and

performance, combining academic study with professional coaching and development.

Beyond the classroom, students benefit from access to excellent sports facilities, including a 3G all-weather pitch, a fully equipped sports hall, trampolines, table tennis, and a dance studio. These spaces support both physical wellbeing and a rich extracurricular life, helping students to build resilience, stay active, and enjoy a healthy balance between study and personal growth.

Our Sixth Form students consistently achieve strong results and progress to a wide range of positive destinations, including top universities, competitive apprenticeships, and meaningful employment. We are proud of their success – and even prouder of the people they become: young adults who lead with kindness, take responsibility, and strive for excellence.

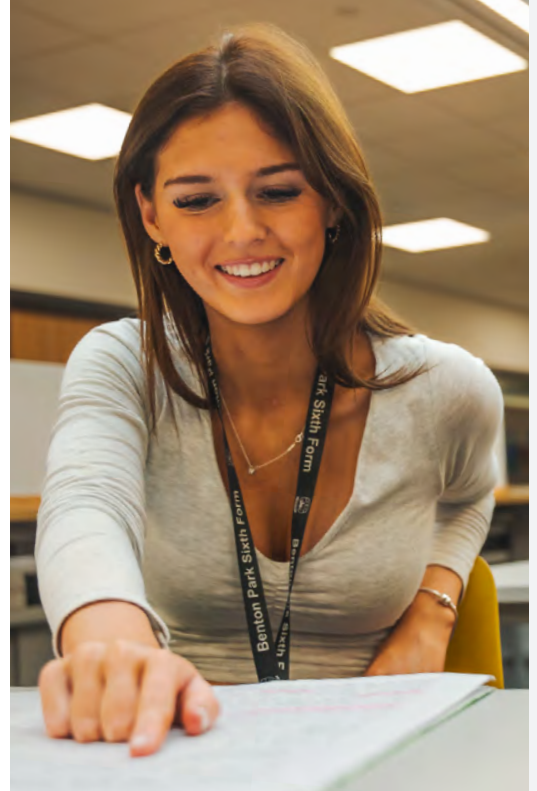
SIXTH FORM STUDENT LEADERSHIP

ADMISSIONS

Benton Park School is an academy and part of Moorlands Learning Trust. Admissions for the start of Year 7 are processed by Leeds City Council Children's Services. Parents with children in the final year of Primary School will receive an application form from the Local Authority to express a preference for a Secondary School. This must be completed and returned by the due date to the Local Authority.
